	focuses on base ten notation, addition and subtraction fluency, addition and
	subtracting with regrouping, standard units of measure and describing and
	analyzing shapes using <i>My Math</i> and Number Talks.
	Science: Students observe, describe, predict and classify information in life
	(Plant and Animal Adventures), physical (Material Magic) and earth (Work
	of Water) sciences using a hands-on and inquiry based approach at
	www.mysteryscience.com
	Social Studies: We dive into a new social studies curriculum, my World
	Interactive by Pearson this year! We cover the topic People Who Make a
	Difference (geography/mapping, government, economics, biographies)
